Dead girl's dad in the dark over arrests

KUALA LUMPUR: Jazimin Abdul Jalil is in the dark on latest developments involving the murder of his daughter Nurin Jazlin.

"Everything that I know now, I've only just learnt from all of you.

"I'm sure the police have their reasons or perhaps want to make sure they have everything in order first before calling me," he told reporters at his home in Wangsa Maju here yesterday.

He was asked about the five suspects, including a woman, who were arrested by police in Shah Alam on Thursday.

The US Federal Bureau of Investigation has also agreed to assist police to enhance the clarity of the blurred web-camera image of the person carrying the sports bag in which Nurin's body was found.

Jazimin said police should inform his family about the progress of investigations.

He remained calm, until a reporter called his handphone and asked how he felt about losing Nurin.

"I am tired of telling you how I feel. If you have children and have lost them in such a manner then you would know how I feel. Simple as that," he retorted.
