

DNA tests in Nurin case

KUALA LUMPUR: Police have taken DNA samples from the two suspects arrested in connection with the abduction and murder of eight-year-old Nurin Jazlin Jazimin.

Deputy Inspector-General of Police Datuk Ismail Omar confirmed that the samples had been sent to the lab for testing.

He said police were working on several leads in the case.

However, Ismail said if the findings failed to tie the men to the crime, they would have no choice but to let them go.

The two men, aged 43 and 32, both security guards, were arrest-

ed on Saturday night and early Sunday to assist in investigations into Nurin's case.

Meanwhile, the four girls who were taken to an abandoned building at Jalan Tun Razak on Sunday, where the 32-year-old suspect was arrested, could not identify the two men.

"The girls also could not identify the location," he said.

The 32-year-old security guard was arrested after he was found to resemble a photofit of Nurin's kidnapper. He also used a black Modenas Kriss motorcycle, like the one used by the Kampung Baru Molester.
