Healer raped me, claims housewife

RAWANG: A young housewife who sought treatment from a healer was drugged and raped instead.

A police source said the 21-year-old woman and her younger sister went to the healer's house in Taman Teja, Rawang, last week.

The man is alleged to have told the sister to wait at his house while he took the housewife on his motorcycle to Templer's Park.

"He took the woman to a river in Templer's Park and rubbed lime juice all over her body and clothes.

"He then asked the housewife to take her clothes off, but she refused," a source said.

"He did not press the issue but offered her lime juice instead.

"The housewife became unconscious after drinking it.

"When she woke up about 15 minutes later, she was naked and the man was on top of her."

The healer raped her.

He then took the crying housewife back on his motorcycle.

Along the way, he stopped the motorcycle, brandished a knife and warned her not to tell anyone what had happened.

When they reached the healer's house, the housewife and her sister left immediately.

She lodged a report at a nearby police station.

In a separate case, a Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI) student avoided being raped by two men when they realised that she was having her period.

The attempt happened on March 11 when the 21-year-old student was riding her motorcycle towards the futsal ground at her campus in Tanjung Malim.

On the way, the back tyre of her motorcycle went flat and she had to stop by the road side.

Two men approached her and offered to seal the puncture.

Giving the excuse they did not bring the necessary equipment, they asked her to follow them to a nearby workshop.

As they passed underneath a railway bridge, the two men dragged her to the ground and tore her clothing off.

As they were about to rape her, they realised she was having her period.

They left her and made off with her belongings including her student identification card, MyKad, a mobile phone and also her ATM cards.

The student managed to hail a passing motorist who sent her to a nearby police station where she lodged a report.
