

Disabled burglar in bid to 'disable' cops

KLANG: A handicapped man with a criminal record was arrested for attempting to run down two policemen and crashing his car into two other vehicles.

About 12.30pm yesterday, two police detectives were waiting for nearly 90 minutes to ambush the 28-year-old burglary suspect, whose left hand is deformed.

The suspect was in a car tyre shop in Lintang Raja Bot, off Jalan Meru, and was leaving the premises in a grey car when he spotted the two detectives on a motorcycle.

In his bid to escape, he reversed his car and crashed into a parked pick-up truck and a motorcycle.

He then tried to run down the detectives, who had to dive for cover. The suspect's car hit a 31-year-old motorcyclist, throwing him on the road. The motorcyclist suffered injuries on the legs and

mouth, and was rushed to the hospital.

Seeing the action of the suspect, one of the policemen fired a single shot, which hit the windscreen of the suspect's car but missed him.

However, the shot made the suspect lose control of his car and crash near a Tenaga Nasional sub-

station.

He tried to flee on foot but the policemen caught and subdued him after a brief struggle.

Police found various house break-in tools in the suspect's car boot. There were also gloves, car stereos and amplifier, and syabu inhaling equipment.
