Selangor flood victims increase to 443

SHAH ALAM: Flood victims in Selangor increased to 443 from 108 families at 5.30pm, compared with 309 from 77 families yesterday morning.

Selangor Fire and Rescue Department assistant director Mohd Sani Harul said a new relief centre was opened at SK Abdul Samad in Klang to house 33 victims from seven families.

Eight relief centres have been opened in Selangor.

"The relief centre at Surau Kampung Lembah Paya, Sepang, recorded the highest number of flood victims with 172 from 42 families, and SK Meru, Klang Hall, with 111 victims.

"Other relief centres are Surau Ladang Tuan Mee in Kuala Selangor (37 victims), Taman Gemilang in Dengkil (23 victims), Salak Lama Community Centre, Kampung Salak Tengah in Sepang (29 victims), Kampung Baru Salak Tinggi Community Centre in Sepang (21 victims) and Klang Municipal Council Hall, Kampung Kuantan in Klang (17 victims)," he said yesterday.

In Ipoh, 20 families comprising 87 flood victims from Kampung

Layang-Layang Kiri, Parit in Perak Tengah are staying at the Surau Nurul Jannah in Parit Layang-Layang Kiri, as of noon yesterday.

In Malacca, flood victims in Alor Gajah increased to 559 from 130 families as at 3pm yesterday, compared with 355 from 91 families at 9am on Sunday.

Alor Gajah District civil defence officer Mohammad Fairul Asikin Kadir said the three new flood-relief centres opened in the district were SK Belimbing Dalam, which was accommodating 306 victims from 67 families.

Kampung Beringin Community Hall accommodated 35 victims from eight families; and Kampung Bukit Balai Community Hall accommodated eight victims from two families.

"Six relief centres are open, while one relief centre, SK Seri Pengkalan, was closed," he said here yesterday.

He said the relief centres at Masjid Ar Rashidin Hall has 107 victims from 22 families; Kampung Gadek Community Hall (93 victims from 28 families) and Kampung Panchor Community Hall (10 victims from three families). **Bernama**

Road damaged by landslide now open to traffic

SUNGAI SIPUT: A road damaged in a landslide here on Saturday has been repaired.

State Public Works Department deputy director Jamilul Nasir Saad said the main access to five villages had been reopened to traffic since midnight yesterday. "What is left to be done now is to resurface the stretch," he said yesterday.

Jamilul said the department had been working round the clock to fix

the problem since receiving the report on Saturday.

"We opened a temporary detour for villagers while we fixed the road," said Jamilul, who added that the detour was 7km from the landslide.

In the 9.30pm incident on Friday, Kampung Perik, Kampung Periang, Kampung Enggor, Karai and Pekan Karai were affected when a landslide destroyed the road. No casualties were reported in the incident.
